Part II - Written Statement of Reasons for Detention

The charge you are facing is obviously more of an administrative problem that you have not complied with directions on how to register and report, but I still have to be concerned about whether or not you will follow the directions that release would involve. Halfway house placement is primarily used for people who have jobs so that they can continue their employment. You have honestly said that you have not had employment for a long time because of these various incarcerations.

Additionally, you did not complete parole successfully on your last conviction, which is essential if you are going to be released. The Court has to have confidence that you are going to follow the conditions.

Considering all of the factors mentioned by the government and in the Pretrial Services Report, you will stay in custody until you get this case resolved.
