ORDER

This matter is before the Court on defendant Deborah J. Riggs’ Motion for *In Camera* Inspection and Protective Order (Doc. 29). The government has filed a response in opposition (Doc. 30). After reviewing the parties’ submissions, and for good cause shown pursuant to Fed. R. Crim. P. 16(d)(1), the Court grants defendant’s request for *in camera* review of the records produced by Dr. Ted Moeller pursuant to the government subpoena. The Court will permit defense counsel to inspect the records prior to the Court’s *in camera* inspection to assist the Court in the identification of privileged documents and/or material that is “essential to fulfill the objective of [the] order [for production], namely, to provide the government, the Court, and Probation the full context of defendant’s mental health and addiction conditions, in compliance with 42 C.F.R. § 2.65(e)(1).”¹ Counsel shall submit a privilege log within ten (10) days of this Order, at which time the Court shall determine if a protective order is necessary. Finally, due to the delay caused by defendant’s request, the Court will continue defendant’s sentencing hearing,
