LEGAL NOTICE

If you signed an Independent Contractor Agreement with TransAm Trucking, Inc., a class action lawsuit may affect your rights.

You may be affected by a class action lawsuit about whether TransAm Trucking, Inc. ("TransAm Trucking") charged its independent contractors a fee for satellite communications systems in violation of the truth-in-leasing regulations at 49 C.F.R. § 376.12(i).

The lawsuit is called Fox, et al. v. TransAm <u>Trucking, Inc., et al.</u>, Case No. 2:12-cv-02706-CM-GLR, and is in the United States District Court for the District of Kansas. The Court decided this lawsuit should be a class action on behalf of a "Class," or group of people, that could include you. This notice summarizes your rights and options before an upcoming trial. More information is in a detailed notice available by request by calling the toll-free number below. If you are included in the Class, you have to decide whether to stay in the Class

and be bound by whatever results or ask to be excluded and keep your right to sue TransAm Trucking. There is no money available now and no guarantee that there will be.

ARE YOU AFFECTED?

All persons, including entities, who operated under an Independent Contractor Agreement that included a satellite communications system usage fee with TransAm Trucking between November 2, 2008, through the present are Class members. If you signed an Independent Contractor Agreement with TransAm Trucking before

November 2, 2008, or have only driven for TransAm Trucking as an employed company driver, you are not in the Class.

WHAT IS THIS CASE ABOUT?

Plaintiffs in this lawsuit claim TransAm Trucking forced them to pay a satellite communications system usage fee in violation of truth-in-leasing regulations.

TransAm Trucking denies that it did anything wrong and contends that it must pay a service provider for its satellite communications system, and it lawfully charges back the cost of that to its drivers. The Court has not decided whether the Class or TransAm Trucking is right. The lawyers for the Class will have to prove their claims at a trial set to begin on September 7, 2015.

WHO REPRESENTS YOU?

The Court approved the law firms of Shaffer Lombardo Shurin and Gregory Leyh, P.C. of Kansas City, Missouri, to represent you as "Class Counsel." You do not have to pay Class Counsel, or anyone else, to participate. Instead, if Class Counsel get money or benefits for the Class, they may ask the Court for attorneys' fees and costs, which would be paid by TransAm Trucking or out of any money recovered, before giving the rest to the Class. You may hire your own lawyer to appear in Court for you; if you do, you have to pay that lawyer. Candace Fox, Anthony Gillespie, and Charles Schreckenbach are Class members like you, and the Court approved them as the "Class Representatives."

WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS?

You have a choice of whether to stay in the Class or not, but you must decide this **now.** If you stay in the Class, you will be legally bound by all orders and judgments of the Court, and you will not be able to sue, or continue to sue, TransAm Trucking– as part of any other lawsuit – for the violations of truth-in-leasing regulations involving charges of satellite communications system usage fees that occurred from November 2, 2008 through the present. If money or benefits are obtained, you will be notified about how to request a share. To stay in the Class, you do not have to do anything now.

If you ask to be excluded from the Class, you cannot get any money or benefits from this lawsuit if any are awarded, but you will keep any rights to sue TransAm Trucking for these claims, now or in the future, and you will not be bound by any orders or judgments of the Court. To ask to be excluded, send a letter to the address below, postmarked by November 10, 2014, that says you want to be excluded from Fox, et al. v. TransAm Trucking, Inc., et al. Include your name, address, and telephone number.
